Wiring FAQs

Q: Does Atlantic Federal Credit Union have a Swift Code or IBAN Number?

A: No.

Q: What is a Swift Code?

A: A SWIFT code, also known as a Bank Identifier Code (BIC), is a unique identification code used for international money transfers between banks. To receive funds from a foreign financial institution, the wire must be transmitted through a US Intermediary/Correspondent Bank. The foreign financial institution would know if they have such a correspondent.

Q: What is an Intermediary Bank?

A: An Intermediary Bank, also known as a Correspondent Bank, is a financial institution that is used when funds are being transferred from one bank to another across different countries or banking systems.

Q: Is there a fee for receiving a wire?
